The conference is to take place in Hungary, the native country of this prominent personality of psychoanalysis. Ferenczi was born at the time of the Austro-Hungarian Monarchy in Miskolc, graduated in Vienna, and worked and lived in Budapest from the turn of the century until his death in 1933. Today, when the Freud-Ferenczi correspondence and also the Clinical Diary have been published and the peculiar silence that surrounded Ferenczi's ideas and experiments has been broken, his oeuvre has finally become accessible. "Without sympathy there is no healing". This could be a motto of Ferenczi's therapeutical activity. A great deal of modern psychoanalytic ideas have their origin in Ferenczi's theoretical and practical work. As Mihály Bálint wrote in 1958: "Ferenczi's last writings not only anticipated the development of psychoanalytic technique of his age, but still contain many ideas that may shed light on problems of the present or even the future. This conference is to be a meeting of researchers and followers of Ferenczi's psychoanalytical legacy, and an attempt is to be made to put Ferenczi into the perspective of contemporary psychoanalysis. It is going to be both a new beginning and continuation. Despite severe historical vicissitudes, Budapest, the venue of the conference has preserved a great deal of the atmosphere of Ferenczi's time as well as some sites closely connected to the history of psychoanalysis: the Rókus Hospital, where Ferenczi began his career, the houses where he lived and worked, the central building of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences where the 5th International Psychoanalytic Congress 1918, and so on.
